

Route 10: Lomonds and Ochils, Falkland, Glendevon & Gleneagles

1.) This route provides a short run south and into Fife before heading west, crossing the M90 and on through the Ochil Hills, by quiet country A and B roads with a short stretch of A9 back to Perth.



3.) You'll drive through Leslie and skirt the town of Glenrothes, pass Loch Leven and cross over the M90 as you head towards the Ochil Hills, by way of Crook of Devon and Rumbling Bridge. You'll follow the Devon river up through some beautiful country and then descend Gleneagles from where you can see across the Strathallan valley to the famous hotel. Admire the well tended golf courses and stop for afternoon tea if you've booked.



2.) You'll begin on the old Edinburgh road through Glenfarg. This wasn't much fun in the old days but now most of the traffic is on the motorway you can really enjoy those bends before turning off and heading to Gateside, Strathmiglo and on to Falkland with its historic palace. From there you'll climb between the Lomond Hills but don't search for the well known loch it's nowhere near here.



4.) Alternatively you can sample one of Auchterarder's tea rooms before returning to Perth via country lanes to Kinkell Bridge and a short stretch of the A9 or take the A9 (left) the whole way, but do mind the speed cameras. Distance approx 70 miles.
