

Route 15 Kinloch Rannoch—Lochs and Mountains

1.) This route includes a mix of good A, B and single track roads. Just out of town take a left and enjoy the quiet Madderty road to Crieff. Follow the A85 through Comrie to St. Fillans where you meet Loch Earn, continue on the A85 or opt for the single track south Loch Earn road, to Lochearnhead.



3.) If you have the time you can drive around Loch Rannoch and along to the remote Rannoch Station. Single track roads and magnificent scenery. From Kinloch Rannoch you'll head east on the B847 with views to Schiehallion.

2.) You'll depart Loch Earn and turn north, follow the Dochart River to the Falls of Dochart at Killin. After a short section of Loch Tay you'll turn left and climb to the Ben Lawers Visitor Centre. As you ascend the lower slopes you'll have a great view back over Loch Tay. Continue around Ben Lawers on the wonderful single track to Glen Lyon, you'll pass Innerwick and the historic Fortingall Yew. North to Kinloch Rannoch but don't miss the left turn for the, more scenic route via Schiehallion.



4.) Follow the Tummel River to Tummel Bridge and take the Glengoulandie road to Kenmore on the eastern banks of Loch Tay. Tackle the spectacular single track over the hills to Glen Quaich and rejoin the A822 at Amulree for quiet country lanes back to Perth. Facilities at: Crieff, Killin, Dochart Falls, Lawers, Glen Lyon, Fortingall, Kinloch Rannoch, Glengoulandie and Kenmore. Total distance approx 140 miles.
